6. Bylaws--  
After a query by President Farrow, Bill Wilkinson promised that the Constitution and Bylaws would be in members hands at the next meeting.
7. Banquet--  
The President appointed a Banquet Coordinating Committee consisting of Mark Cheren(chairman), Dave Mitchel, Lorin Johnson, Bill Wilkinson, Dick Haynes and Jack Kooyoomjian.
8. Pledge Class--Thompson

9. Capital Outlay Fund--Haynes  
Moved(Haynes); that a capital outlay fund be instituted, each brother being assessed 50¢ per semester retroactive from February 1, 1962. Expenditures from this fund will be determined by the Finance Committee and approved by the brotherhood.(seconded)
