Duties of Officers

Section 7. PRASTOCOT. The President shall give supervision to the chaoter and its officers, and see that its constitutional duties and obligations, National and KAMAK, focal, are fulfilled. He shall preside at all meetings of the chapter and the descutive Committee, shall serve as a member of the Advisory Committee, and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees. He shall coordinate the functions of all chapter officers and committees. He shall follow the authorized procedure in appointing the regular committee chairmen and follow through in seeing that the committee personnel is properly selected. He shall appoint any special committees necessary for expediency in carrying out the program of the chapter. He shall perform such other duties as his office may require.

Section 2. FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT. The First Vice-President shall serve as Chairman of the Service Committee. He shall perform all presidential functions in the absence of the President and shall carry out such other easignments as the President may prescribe.

Section 3. S-COND VICE-PRESIDENT. The Second Vice-President shall serve as Chairman of the Hembership Committee. He shall perform all presidential functions in the absence of the President and Pirst Vice-President, and shall carry out such other assignments as the President may prescribe.

Section 4. THIRD VICE-PRESIDENT. The Third Vice-President shall be in charge of the Administrative Officers of the chapter as well as the Followship, Benquet and Program Chairmen. He shall perform all presidential functions in the absence of the President and the First and Second Vice-Presidents, and shall carry out such other assignments as the President may prescribe.

Section 5. RECORDING SECRETARY. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate written record of the proceedings of all chapter meetings, and of the meetings of the executive Committee. He shall secure the minutes of the meetings of the regular and special committees of the chapter and enter them in the minutes book. He shall perform all other duties pertaining to the office of Secretary as prescribed by the chapter. He shall train his successor and turn over all records in an up-to-date condition.

Secretary shall issue all chapter notices and invitations, carry on all necessary correspondence with the National Office, and direct letters of appreciation to persons and organizations who have cooperated in the chapter service program. He shall also cooperate with the Alumni Secretary in sending the chapter newsletter to all alumni. He shall be the limison between the local chapter and the campus newspaper, and perform such other duties as his office may require. He shall train his successor and turn over all records in an up-to-date condition.

Section 7. TRESURER. The Treasurer shall receive all members of the chapter and keep an accurate record thereof. He shall make all payments of chapter accounts, upon proper authorization. He shall diligently collect all membership fees and dues, pledge and initiation fees, and all assessments. He shall keep an accurate written record of the payments made by each individual member of the chapter, either for the National Fraternity or for the chapter, and give a written receipt for all such funds. He shall transmit promptly the funds due the National Fraternity, either for pledge fees, national membership fees, life membership fees, and supplies, and to keep on file all receipts for such payments. He shall deposit the funds of the Fraternity, both local and national funds, with the Business Officer of the University. He shall prepare an annual return on Form 990A and file it

with the U. S. Director of Internal Rovenue in the district in which the chapter is located. He shall have the financial books of the chapter properly audited at the close of his term as Treasurer before taxning over the duties of his office to a newly elected Treasurer. He shall make reports on the condition of the chapter treasurery to chapter meetings and to meetings of the executive Committee. He shall perform all other such duties as required by his office.

Section 8. ALUMNI SECRETARY. The Alumni Secretary shall keep an accurate record of the present addresses and occupations of all Alumni Members of the chapter. He shall enlist the support of the Alumni Members in the matters pf program and membership of the chapter. He shall work in man cooperation with the other chapter officers in arranging for at least one major event each year in which the alumni will be especially invited and will have an honored position on the program. He shall plan ways of rendering service, courtesies, and recognition to alumni members returning to the sam campus for special college functions. He shall endeavor to inform all alumni about chapter activities by means of a regular newsletter.

Section 9. HISTORIAN. The Historian shall write a detailed and accurate history of the chapter covering the period of his office. He shall maintain a scrapbook containing photographs and newspaper clippings pertaining to the activities of the chapter during his term of office, and he shall be in charge of the two chapter bulletin boards. He shall be responsible for the promotion and preservation of all chapter traditions.

Section 10. SEROEANT-AT-ARES. The Sorgeant-at-Arms shall guard the portal and perform such disciplinary and parliamentary procedures as are deemed necessary by the President. He shall distribute ballot sheets on all occasions when voting is done in writing, then upon instructions of the presiding officer assemble the ballots and have charge of the counting. He shall be responsible for taking care of chapter equipment, such as initiation materials, flag, banner, gavel, and other chapter properties. He shall keep an accurate written record of the attendanceof each member at all chapter meetings, and inform the Executive Committee whenever any member becomes delinquent or inactive. He shall keep in a permanent file the duplicate of each membership application, beginning with the charter members and including all subsequent members.

Section 11. PLEDGETASTER. The Pledgemaster shall give all pledges opportunity to learn the fundamentals of Alpha Phi Omega and become imbued with the spirit of this Fraternity before their initiation into active membership. He shall accure the necessary membership applications from all now pledges and all new members and forward them to

Section 12. CHAIRMAN OF ADVISORY COMMITTEES. The Chairman shall call and proside at meetings of the Advisory Committee at least three times a year for the purpose of discussing and making suggestions for the chapter program, and administration. He shall make periodic reports in writing to the Mational Praternity as outlined in the requirements of the National Constitution and By-Laws. shall call and preside at special chapter meetings at any time upon the written request of one-third of the active members when it is not possible to secure through the regular procedure as prescribed in the National Constitution and By-Laws, and in the Constitution and By-Laws of thes chapter. (See Article I National By-Laws, and Article V Chapter By-Laws.) He shall serve as presiding officer at any triels of disconduct of chapter members. He shall assign each advisor to active duty on one of the chapter committees. He shall attend meetings regularly and serve as advisor and counselor at all times to the chapter, its members, and its officers. He shall give leadership to gotting the program and administration of the chapter under way at the beginning of each school year.

Section 13. FACULTY ADVISORS. The Faculty Advisors shall encourage the development of high fraternal and scholastic standards. They shall assist the chapter in planning and carrying out projects. They shall attend chapter meetings as regularly as possible. They shall merve as new bers of the Advisory Committee. They shall serve as porsonal advisors and counselors on chapter matters at all times. They shall serve as special advisors to the respective chapter committees as assigned by the Chairman of the Advisory Committee. Atth the chairman they shall give leadership to getting the chapter program under way at the beginning of the school year.

shall give counsel and advice to the chapter regarding its Scouting relationships. They shall encourage high fraternal and Scouting standards. They shall attend chapter meetings as regularly as possible. They shall serve as members of the Advisory Committee. They shall give assistance to the chapter in planning and carrying out projects which are in the interest of the Scout lovement and the community at large. Orking with the Faculty Advisors they shall give leadership to getting the chapter program under way at the beginning of the school year.
